Texans shall minimize social gatherings and minimize in-person contact with people who are not in the same household.</p>
<p>Attend church, worship services, funerals, burials and memorials</p>	<p>Follow State and CDC guidelines – Alternating rows, 6 feet spacing, provide service for at risk population to watch remotely or have designated area and allow the 25% capacity rule.</p>
<p>Weddings</p>	<p>Follow State, CDC, Restaurant guidelines – Alternating rows, 6 feet spacing, provide service for at risk population to watch remotely or have designated area and allow the 25% capacity rule.</p>

<p>As of 12:01 AM Friday, May 1 the following services were reopened with restrictions:</p> <p>In-store retail services Movie theaters Golf Courses Shopping Malls/Outdoor plazas and markets</p>	<p>Follow State and CDC guidelines - Practice social distancing. These services reopened up to 25 % of the total listed occupancy.</p>
<p>On May 8, 2020 the following businesses will open with restrictions</p> <p>Salons, cosmetologists, nail salons, barber shops and tanning salons</p> <p>Indoor swimming pools</p> <p>Outdoor swimming pools</p> <p>Local public swimming pools</p> <p>Restaurants/Food Establishments</p>	<p>1 client at a time, Clients are allowed to wait inside ONLY IF the 6 feet distancing works, if not, clients are to wait in their vehicles. Clients must wear masks. 6 feet distancing must be maintained between stations.</p> <p>May operate up to 25% of the total listed occupancy of the swimming pool facility.</p> <p>May operate up to 25% of the normal operating limits as determined by the swimming pool operator.</p> <p>May operate ONLY IF permitted by the local government.</p> <p>Follow State and CDC guidelines - Practice social distancing. These services may reopen at up to 25 % of the total listed capacity.</p>
<p>On May 18, 2020 the following businesses will open with restrictions</p> <p>Gyms / Exercise Facilities and Classes</p> <p>Non-essential Manufacturers</p> <p>Office-Based Buildings</p>	<p>Follow State and CDC guidelines – may operate up to 25% of the total listed occupancy. Locker rooms and showers remain CLOSED, but restrooms may be open.</p> <p>Follow State and CDC guidelines – may operate up to 25% of the total listed occupancy.</p> <p>Follow State and CDC guidelines – may operate their offices with up to the greater of 5 individuals or 25% of the total office workforce.</p>

Facilities such as schools, nursing homes, etc.	Follow State Regulations.
Graduation Ceremonies	<p>Virtual graduation ceremonies are approved and may proceed in accordance with local plans</p> <p>Graduation ceremonies during which graduates and their families participate from their vehicles may proceed effective May 15 in accordance with local plans.</p> <p>Between May 15 and May 28, 2020, an outdoor ceremony will be permitted in a rural county that has an attestation as described in the "Texans Helping Texans: The Governor's Report to Open Texas" (April 27, 2020) that remains in effect 7 days prior to the ceremony. As of this time, McLennan County has too many cases to satisfy the attestation requirement of 5 or fewer active cases.</p> <p>In-person, outdoor ceremonies may take place in any county on or after May 29. Be advised, the Governor's executive order guidance is subject to change as underlying public health conditions change.</p> <p>In-person indoor ceremonies are not yet permitted under current executive orders related to public health</p>
